On June 7, 2010, on behalf of Mother Seton School, Sister JoAnne Goecke, D.C., Principal, received recognition from the Girl Scout Council of the Nations Capital for their years of support to Girl Scouting. The award was presented by Troop Leader, Marjorie Bosche.

Girl scouting has had a presence at Mother Seton School in some capacity for at least 35 years. “I know that there were definitely troops meeting at MSS for the last ten years,” said Mrs. Bosche. Girl Scouts at Mother Seton School live out their Girl Scout promise in various local ways. As part of their service project commitment, the girls have volunteered at St. Catherine’s Nursing Center in Emmitsburg, worked outside to help maintain and preserve the grounds of Mother Seton School, organized collections for local shelters, and volunteered at the Lewistown fire hall dinners. The Mother Seton School Girl Scouts also go camping, hiking, participate in team building activities, and make crafts. “I try to always make the girls realize that they are a small part of a larger whole, but a small part that can make an enormous difference to that whole,” said Bosche.



Last year, Mother Seton School hosted a Daisy troop for kindergarten and grade 1, Brownies for grade 2 and 3, and Juniors for grades 4 and 5. The entire troop is approximately 40 girls.
